Colour matching activities

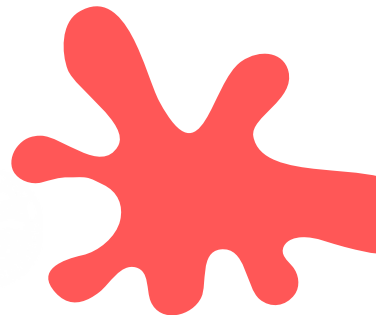
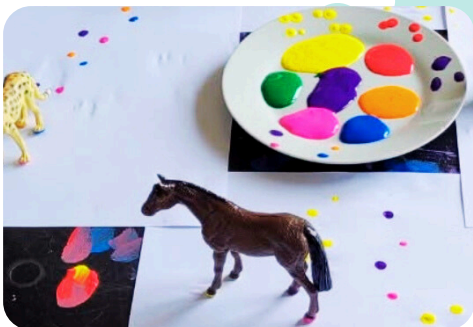
